EXCITING BUILDING UPGRADES AT THE ACADEMY!

We are delighted to announce some fantastic upgrades to our Academy building that will enhance both security and comfort for everyone. These improvements have been eagerly anticipated, long in the preparation and we are delighted to share the details with you.

NEW FRONT DOOR

One of the most significant upgrades to our building is the installation of a brand-new front door. This improvement was identified as necessary when the building was originally repurposed in 2018. This long-awaited improvement significantly boosts the security of the building, markedly reduces energy use and stops the recurring puddles due to incoming rain during the winter. The update also improves the building's appearance, as well as its functionality.

The new entryway features advanced access control systems, ensuring that only authorised personnel can enter the premises. Additionally, it keeps the reception area much warmer and drier. This upgrade provides peace of mind for staff, and visitors, knowing that their safety and comfort are our top priorities. LIFT PROGRAMME

NATIONAL IMAGING ACADEMY WALES HAS BEEN SUCCESSFULLY HOSTING A LIFT (LONGITUDINAL INTEGRATED FOUNDATION TRAINING) PROGRAMME WITHIN RADIOLOGY SINCE 2021 AND WE HAVE SEEN 9 TRAINEES COMPLETE THE PROGRAMME IN THE PAST THREE YEARS.

This Radiology LIFT Programme has provided F1 doctors with regular service training sessions in various settings, offering one day per week of Radiology experience over the year-long rotation at Cwm Taf Morgannwg UHB Radiology Departments and NIAW. This is integrated with their primary rotations in Emergency Medicine, General Surgery, and General Medicine. Designed by the NHS, the programme aims to evolve training models to equip future doctors with a more diverse skill set, enabling them to meet the ever-changing healthcare needs of society. F1s receive training at both NIAW and Radiology Departments within CTM UHB Hospitals during their placements. The goal of the Radiology LIFT Programme is for F1s to develop an understanding of Radiology, including appropriate referral and patient pathways, as well as basic image interpretation skills.

We have asked one of our former LIFT trainees, Dr Megan Simpkins, to share her insights and experiences from the LIFT programme hosted by NIAW. We are also delighted that Megan has successfully applied and been accepted into the South Wales Radiology Training Programme and started in August 2024.



completed the LIFT (Longitudinal Integrated Foundation Training) programme in Radiology during my FY1 year (2022-2023) in Cwm Taf Morganwwg Health Board, which meant spending one day a week in Radiology across the year over the 3 rotations (with the exception of when on-call). The reasons behind choosing this was due to not getting much exposure to the specialty during medical school and knowing how radiology is involved in most areas of medicine and plays a key role in the majority of patient journeys both in hospital and in the community. I was fortunate to be able to attend registrar teaching sessions at the National Imaging Academy Wales which were matched to the current rotation, for example MSK teaching during my time in A+E which helped with my understanding of imaging particularly in minor injuries. These sessions also gave me an insight into life as a trainee. I was lucky to be able to get involved in projects including audit work and case studies, where I attended the BIR congress in London following a poster submission. As well as this, I was able to observe various aspects of the roles in radiology including interventional lists, vetting or reporting sessions, US lists, Fluoroscopy, MDTs and time spent with radiographers. This variety of exposure and experience in the speciality and talking to different radiologists about their training and role made me want to apply to the Radiology training programme. I feel privileged to be starting the South Wales training scheme in August and I would highly recommend this LIFT programme to any future foundation doctors.



I enjoyed the exposure to radiology and the CT teaching sessions at The Academy, I found these very useful in my working life. This also made me more confident in (at least trying to!) interpret scans while working in surgery and emergency medicine. I thoroughly enjoyed the radiology training days at The Academy, these were very nicely organised and I learned a lot at them. The structure of these days were excellent and the info packs/food/lanyards being prepared and of high standard made it all very professional.
